On May 15 the Centers for Disease Control removed its recommendation to avoid travel to Mexico due to the H1N1/swine flu situation. The World Health Organization gave its clearance for international travel on May 7, saying that it did not believe it was necessary to restrict travel to any countries, including Mexico, in response to the H1N1/swine flu situation.
